 Uneven implementation of Bologna tools at national level – quality assurance, ECTS

 Difficulties to mutualise strengths and share joint resources - financial, human, digital and physical resources, and services.

 Common criteria for a European label for joint programmes, followed possibly by voluntary joint degrees based on these European criteria

WIDENING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE EUROPEAN STUDENT CARD INITIATIVE



Two flagship initiatives

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EUROPEAN DEGREE LABEL Institutional Laboratory Explore common criteria leading to a potential **European label for joint programmes**, to be piloted as of 2022 under Erasmus+. Later on, the possible design and delivery, on a voluntary basis, at national, regional or institutional level, of joint degrees at all levels, based on these co-created European criteria, could be envisaged

Erasmus + pilot call topic 1: Pilot a joint European degree label



Examining the need for and feasibility of institutionalised cooperation instruments, such as a possible **legal status for alliances of higher education institutions:** pilot as of 2022 under Erasmus+ the implementation of existing European instruments

Erasmus + pilot call topic 2:

Pilot institutionalised EU cooperation instruments to explore the feasibility for a possible European legal status for alliances of higher education institutions Key features of a possible joint degree Full respect of Member States competence

Pilot a joint European degree label

A step by step approach

2023: Test the co-developed criteria in selected pilots

The pilots will test the proposed criteria and make proposals for their optimisation and further steps.

2024 and beyond: follow up action at EU level

Analyse the results of the pilots to inform future possible developments towards a possible joint degree based on co- created European criteria.

Exploring and testing the relevance of the criteria

Exploring and recommending possible optimisation of the set of criteria

Elaborating proposals aiming to facilitate the development and implementation of joint degrees in Europe. This would **include proposing an approach for the delivery of joint degrees based on co-created European criteria**.

How to test the criteria?

Screening existing joint programmes for compliance with the criteria

Identification of compliant joint programmes

Contribution to the **creation of the template of the European joint degree label** (physical and/or digital)

Awarding the label to students

Conducting a joint reflection, with authorities and stakeholders, on the optimisation of the proposed set of criteria and possible scenarios for the **delivery of a joint degree**
